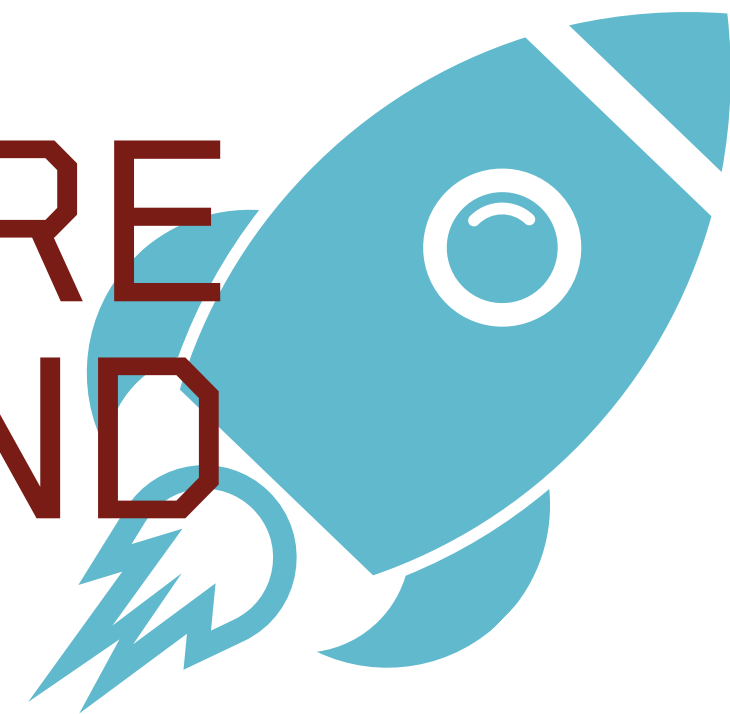

ROADMAP INTEREST EXPLORATION

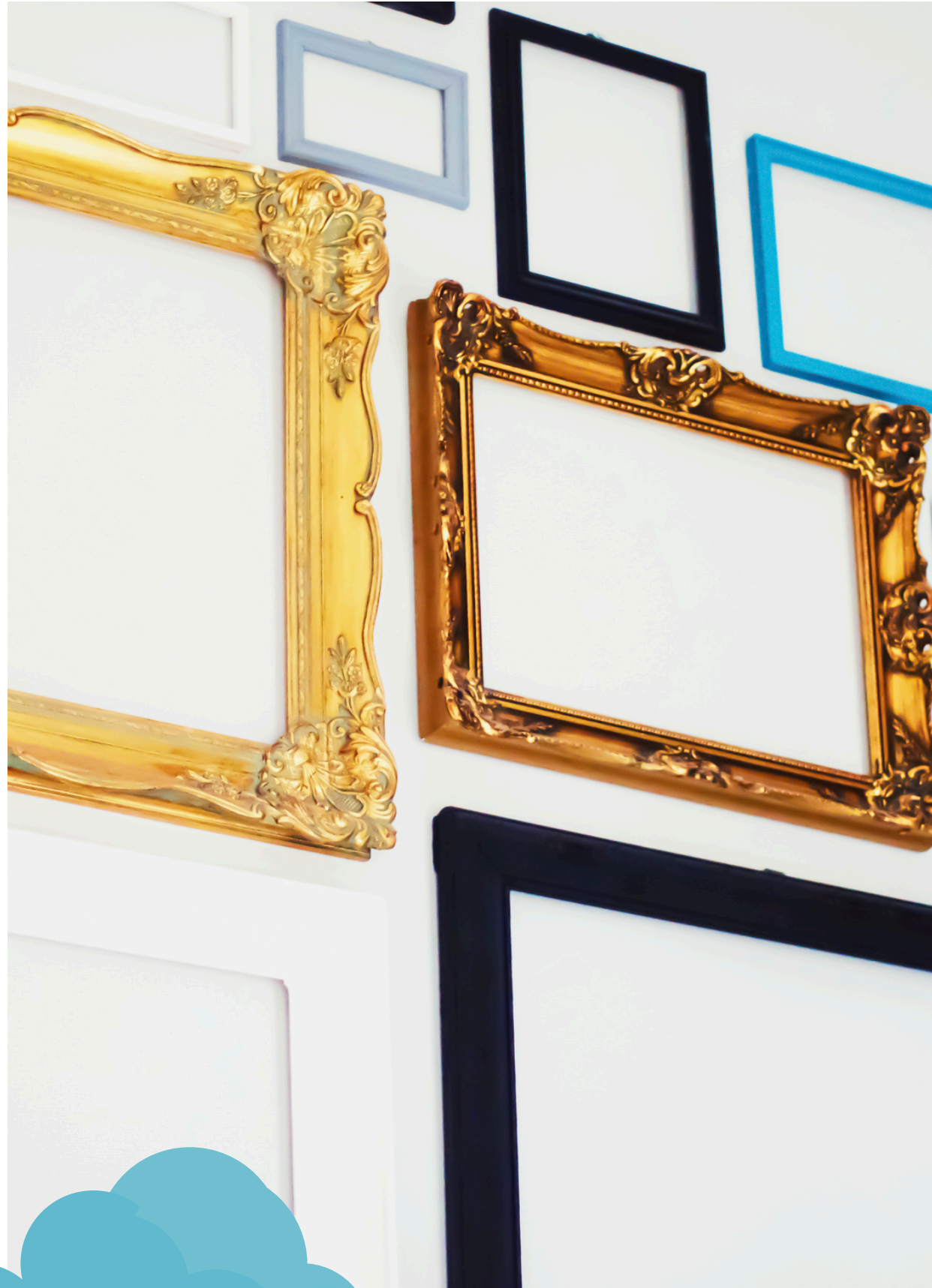
Think

Let's focus on the "being"



Core Interests

- Areas of interest that you find yourself focused on
- Classes or subjects that you look forward to or wish you could take in school



Driving Force (this is a type of core interest)

- Things that make you happy
- Larger social justice or community issues that you care about and would like to have a positive impact on
- The mark you want to leave on the world

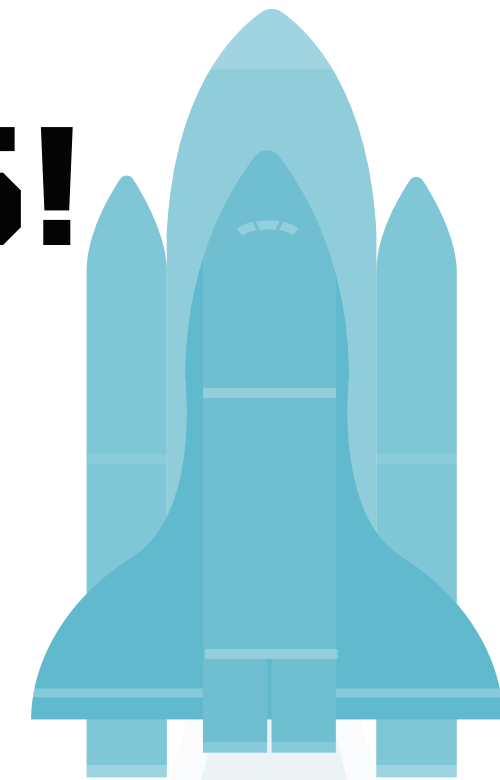


COLLEGE BOUND SCHOLARS!

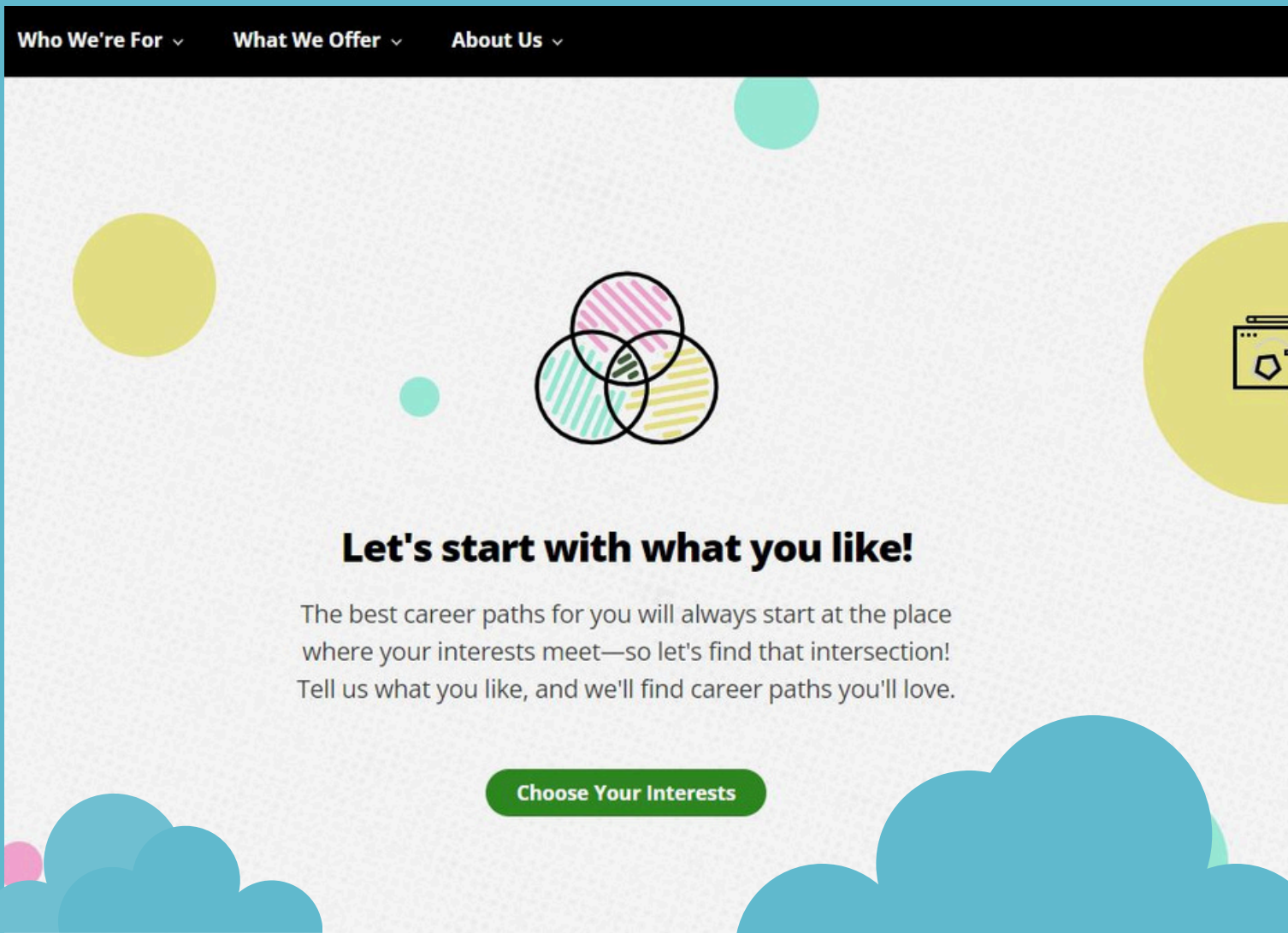




Identify.
